Reflection

"Do to others as you would have them do to you." It is the simplest of lessons we learn when we are children. Thus, somewhere along our life journey, we forget this fundamental lesson and succumb to our greediness and selfishness, making ourselves the most important person rather than our neighbor. This is why Jesus says, "You will be children of the Most High," for as Jesus teaches in Luke 18:17, "Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." The path to peace and holiness is found in the childlike nature of forgiveness, charity, and humility. An example is my personal story: I had a spiritual authoritative figure I looked up to for support, compassion, and guidance. Things were going well for a while until all was revealed, and what came out of the encounter for the longevity of my experience with this individual was a betrayal of my trust and damage to my spirit. It created wounds that are still in the process of being healed today. This lesson applies not just to the laity but also to relations between clergy and parishioners. If we are not careful, we can affect the work of the spirit in the church's life by affecting vocations, sacraments, and the quality of spiritual life in our neighbors due to envy, jealousy, miscommunication/misinterpretation, or even spite. The conclusion to my story is yet to be written, but healing has begun. A Chinese proverb states, "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." Though my journey is not over, it started by forgiving my enemy and those whom I have animosity towards. It is a journey and not an easy one, but it doesn't have to be traveled alone or without charity. As Jesus says, "But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you" (Matthew 5:44). Let us accompany one another on our journeys and ask the Lord to help us to forgive our enemies and those who persecute us. A couple of questions to reflect on this week:

- How do I pray for my enemies and those who have persecuted or wounded me?
- Have I been an enemy to my neighbor or caused them to stumble on their spiritual journey?

About The Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC)

- The Polish National Catholic Church(PNCC) adopted a "Joint Declaration on Unity" with the Roman Catholic Church through which both bodies agreed to a limited communion arrangement.
 - o We are in Dialogue with the Roman Catholic Church
- The Polish National Catholic Church(PNCC) permits <u>divorced people</u> to participate fully in the Mass and to receive the Eucharist. The church does not recognize civil divorce and requires an annulment before parishioners can remarry.
- The Polish National Catholic Church(PNCC) is governed by its Constitution and Laws. The legislative authority of the Church is vested in the General Synod, the Special Synod, the Diocesan Synod, and the Parish Meeting. In financial and administrative matters, the Parishioners possess administrative authority. Representatives elected at the Annual Parish Meeting and confirmed by the Diocesan Bishop exercise their constitutional authority.

 - o 7. Matrimony
